INTRODUCTION

For those who are using this guide with children, please make sure you talk with them *each day* about what they are writing. I tried to choose verses that are easier to understand and explain. However, there are mature and maybe confusing themes throughout the books (especially in 1 Corinthians and Ecclesiastes). There will be some partial quotes that begin and/or end in passages that they will not be writing, but you will...so they will need to know who said it, and why they said it, along with other important details. It'll be important not to leave your child / grandchild / student wondering about what they just wrote. I believe it will be a fantastic way for you both to learn and grow together, but this version will be less daunting for them since there won't be so much to copy. The maps will be helpful to show where many of these events took place.

While you are free to print out this book, you might simply consider printing out the day's page, or a week at a time, from the PDF - it's completely up to you. The fully bound book may be too heavy and bulky for them to enjoy. You may want to collect their writing in a three ring binder, so that they can see what they've accomplished and learned as it accumulates, and it will be a valuable keepsake at the end of the year.

At the top of the page is the statement: "God is so good! What will this verse teach me about Him?" This is something that will be wonderful for them to consider every day as they write and grow in their relationship to Him. It will give you even more to talk about with them. He is good in every way, every day, even when the way seems hard.

The pages aren't fancy or colorful but the words are so important because they come from God. My prayer is that this will bless you and bless them as you grow in the word and grow in your relationships with each other and with the Lord!

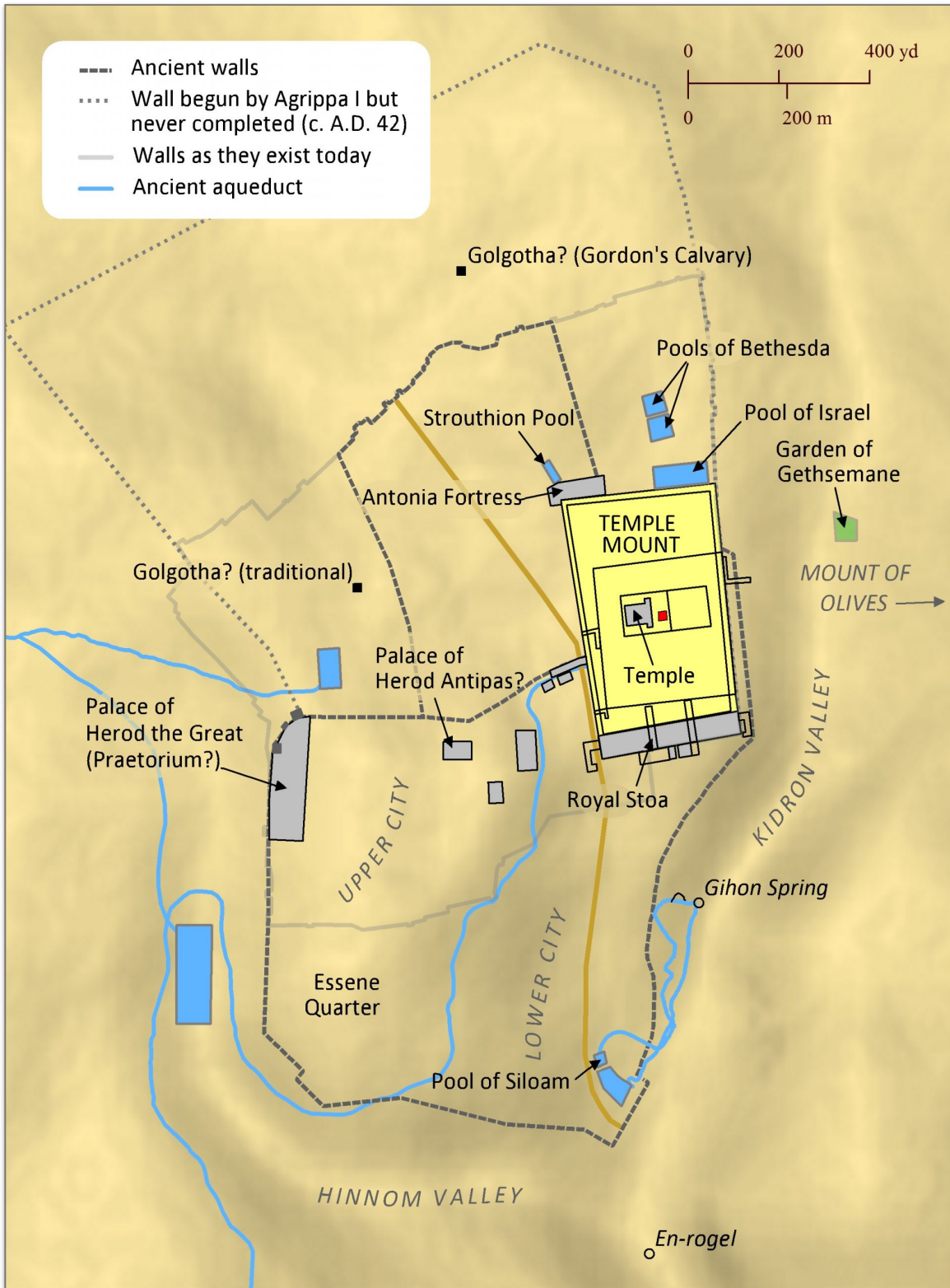
